#### **1<sup>ST</sup> NEWSLETTER**

The Association of Applied Linguistics of Brazil (ALAB) is pleased to promote the 14<sup>th</sup> Brazilian Congress of Applied Linguistics (14<sup>th</sup> CBLA) from July 14<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at the Federal University of Sergipe (UFS). Upon completing 35 years (1990-2025) and with the aim of giving national and international visibility to research in Applied Linguistics (AL), ALAB invites associated people, researchers, students, teachers and professionals from AL, and related areas, to publicize and share their research, completed and/or in progress, in this edition of CBLA in which the theme is “Languages, territories and bodies in movement”.

The 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA aims to bring together the Brazilian and foreign community engaged in research in the field of language-and-society studies to discuss issues related to the theme of the event in the various fields of AL, promoting the exchange of knowledge, experiences and practices coming from different cultural, professional and research areas. Furthermore, the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA will promote the 1<sup>st</sup> Applied Linguistics Exchange in Basic Education (1<sup>st</sup> ILAEB) and will continue two activities that are part of the congress: the 2<sup>nd</sup> Scientific Initiation Colloquium (2<sup>nd</sup> JIC) (for undergraduate students) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Theses Seminar (2<sup>nd</sup> SETE) (for doctoral students).

#### **1. The theme of the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA**

##### *Languages, territories and bodies in movement*

At the crossroads of the social world, in the flow of bodies in movement and in the incessant mobilization of language resources, social fabrics whose seams are dynamic, fluid and contingent are produced. Understanding its folds, ties, knots and tears becomes a fundamental action to intervene, subvert and produce new lines in this fabric – of escape, of transit, of lives. This scenario of complexities, especially marked by the failure of Eurocentric models of politics, economics and language, has demanded from different fields of knowledge other ways to produce intelligibility about social life and, above all, political action with a view to producing alternatives for another globalization.

In this sense, the 14<sup>th</sup> Brazilian Congress of Applied Linguistics, the CBLA, aims to make different language agencies visible, in articulation with bodies and territories, which constitute contemporary ways of survival, resistance and re-existence to colonialism, colonialities, social inequalities, to epistemic injustices and violence of various kinds. To this end, we wish to pay attention to those voices erased from the great hegemonic narratives, in order to (un)learn from their epistemologies, ontologies and cosmologies, such as traditional and terreiro communities, Afro-indigenous peoples and social movements in cities, the countryside, rivers and forests.

Our congress will be located on one of the peripheries of the geopolitics of Brazilian academic knowledge and its modern-colonial hierarchies, but which is also, and above all, a historically propitious territory for the confabulation of languages of resistance. The Northeast of the Revolta dos Malês, in Bahia, of the Quilombo dos Palmares of Dandara and Zumbi, in Alagoas, of the indigenous resistance of the chiefs Serigy, Aperipê, Siriri, Japarutuba and Surubi, in Sergipe, will also be the Northeast of the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA.

We wish to welcome to São Cristóvão, at the Federal University of Sergipe (UFS), researchers in Applied Linguistics and related areas, coming from different Brazilian territories and abroad, interested in the relationships between languages, bodies, territories and their movements.

## **2. The 1<sup>st</sup> ILAEB – AL Exchange in basic education**

This event aims to contribute more directly to Basic Education, through exchanges between teachers and students who work and/or research at this level of education. To this end, the proposal is that, through different presentation formats (e.g. experience reports), the event can serve as a showcase of good practices and successful experiences in the field of language education, as well as an open field for reflections about the knowledge and actions of people engaged in education and research, committed to basic education. Each participant may submit only one paper in the form an abstract as the first author.

## **3. The 2<sup>nd</sup> JIC – ALAB Scientific initiation colloquium**

The ALAB Board of Directors 2023-2025 has as its purposes the circulation of knowledge and the concern with research also at undergraduate level. In this sense, in 2025, as part of the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA, the 2<sup>nd</sup> ALAB Scientific Initiation Colloquium in Applied Linguistics will be held, as a way of encouraging the training of scientists in the area. The target audience for the event is made up of undergraduate students in Languages and related areas, whose research is focused on the relationships between languages and social practices. Each participant may submit, as first author, only one paper in the form of an abstract. The supervisor must appear as such in the submitted abstract.

## **4. The 2<sup>nd</sup> SETE – ALAB Theses in progress seminar**

With the aim of promoting actions to strengthen graduate studies in AL, in 2025, as part of the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA, the 2<sup>nd</sup> ALAB Theses in Progress Seminar will be held, in which doctoral students who wish to discuss their ongoing investigations will be able to do so with senior research teams in AL. Students with at least one qualification already completed on their course may register. Each participant in this activity can submit only one paper in the form of an expanded abstract as the first author. The supervisor must appear as such in the submitted abstract.

## **5. The thematic axes**

For the submission and presentation of papers, the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA will be organized into thematic axes, which will bring together papers related to the theme of the event, considering the research lines and the role of Applied Linguistics in contemporary times. The thematic axes planned for the Congress are:

02. Affections and emotions in AL
03. Language acquisition and processing
04. Arts and literature in different contexts
05. Traditional communities, ancestry and language practices
06. Media discourses
07. Sexual dissent, queer/cuir theories and language studies
08. Dissemination and popularization of AL
09. Teaching and learning languages in the context of formal and non-formal education
10. Language teaching in childhood and early school years
11. Bi/multilingual education
12. Language Education and practices of language
13. Curricular internships and teacher training programs
14. Cognitive studies and language
15. Critical language studies
16. Decolonial and ethnic-racial studies in AL
17. Gender studies, feminisms and AL

18. Text and discourse studies
19. Linguistic repertoires, style and critical sociolinguistics
20. Training of educators
21. Artificial Intelligence and language
22. Internationalization and language planning
23. Literacies, multiliteracies and literacy
24. Language and identity practices
25. Language teaching materials

## 6. Registration and participation methods

Registration for the 14<sup>th</sup> CBLA will only take place electronically, on the event page. All participants must be in compliance with ALAB fees. The registration fee is assigned according to the category and connection to ALAB and can be paid after approval of the paper proposal (at the rate in force at the time).

Each participant may only present one (1) paper as the first author. In case of submission of papers together with supervisors, within the 2<sup>nd</sup> JIC and 2<sup>nd</sup> SETE, they should not be considered co-authors. Following the principles of good practice in research ethics, it is not recommended that supervisors are automatically appointed as co-authors of the paper of those they supervised. However, if it is truly a co-authored production, both people must be indicated as authors.

It is also worth noting that the maximum number of papers presented at the event per author (adding their authorship and co-authorship) is two (2) papers.

### 6.1 Participation Methods

- **With Paper Presentation:**

**1) Coordination of Thematic Symposium (14<sup>th</sup> CBLA):** intended for the exhibition and discussion of papers with previously defined common themes, within the Thematic Axes of the event. Two to three people, with a doctorate degree and associated with ALAB, will be appointed as coordinators of the session, which will bring together between six (6) and twelve (12) papers by different authors.

**2) Oral Communication in Thematic Symposium (14<sup>th</sup> CBLA):** intended for the presentation of papers within the Thematic Symposia offered. If the paper is approved, but has exceeded the capacity for papers per Thematic Symposium, it will be recommended for presentation as a Free Oral Communication.

**3) Free Oral Communication (14<sup>th</sup> CBLA):** intended for the presentation of papers that will be allocated in sessions, according to the theme informed at the time of submission, which will be coordinated by people indicated by the event organization, among those participating in the session.

**4) Free Oral Communication (1<sup>st</sup> ILAEB):** intended for the presentation of papers in sessions within the 1<sup>st</sup> AL Exchange in Basic Education.

**5) Free Oral Communication (2<sup>nd</sup> SETE):** intended for the presentation of doctoral research in progress in sessions within the 2<sup>nd</sup> ALAB Theses in Progress Seminar.

**6) Poster (2<sup>nd</sup> JIC):** intended for the presentation of papers by undergraduate students, working on Scientific Initiation projects, in poster sessions according to the thematic axes of the event.

- **Without Paper Presentation:**

Participation modality that allows access to the event and receipt of a certificate upon registration and payment.
